

### MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

In the First Reading, from the Book of Wisdom (1:13-15, 2:23-24), we have one of the most profound statements in the entire Bible. It is a restatement and an affirmation of the creation story from the Book of Genesis, and it tells us a great deal about God's original plan and His relationship with mankind. "God made Man in His own image and likeness, to be imperishable." He made all things "good" and He "did not make death." So, if God made all things "good," where did disease and death come from? The last verse of this passage gives us the answer: SIN. Mankind was made to live and walk with, to talk to and even eat with God without barriers; just like Adam and Eve did before they sinned. Once sin came into the world, these privileges were taken away; that is, until Jesus came. Jesus showed mankind how we might be renewed in spirit so that we can again approach the Father. The theme then, of this and the following readings, is to thank God and praise Him for giving us the means to avoid sin and spiritual death; and, further, to ask God's help in all our activities.

The Responsorial Psalm is (30:2, 4-6, 11-13). This is a prayer of someone who experienced the saving help of God; and now he praises and thanks God for "drawing me clear" of danger and possible "death." "Going down into the pit" was an ancient Jewish way of expressing death and damnation.

The Second Reading is from St. Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians (8:7-15). In this passage, Paul is referring to a collection that was to be taken up among the Corinthians for the benefit of the Jerusalem Church, which was being persecuted by the Jews. The people there were in desperate need of funds to purchase food. He is using the analogy of Jesus Christ who gave up all earthly possessions and life for the benefit of all mankind. Thus, he is reminding the Corinthians that when they have been so blessed as they were, they must show their appreciation to God by blessing others in need. We must do the same especially when we have received greatly from God or from anyone; we must give Glory to God, for His love is without end.

The Gospel Reading is taken from the Gospel of Mark (5:21 -43). This is a double story of God's mercy and compassion being poured out on two individuals, one a poor woman who had nothing to lose and everything to gain by approaching Jesus. The other was a well-to-do synagogue official. They came to Jesus in faith and trust; and He answered their prayers beyond their greatest expectations, restoring the woman to perfect health and giving the then dead girl back to her father, alive and well.

The point of all of this is that God in Jesus Christ does not measure us by our financial or social status. He is only interested in loving us and fulfilling our needs as we bring them to Him in faith and trust. Even wealthy people have problems or situations that cannot be resolved by their wealth; and those less fortunate sometimes have nowhere else to go but to God; and yet many fail to do so. How sad! I have heard people say, "Oh, I didn't want to bother Jesus with such a small matter." Now, think about how you would feel if one of your loved ones said that about you when they were really in need. Something to think about during your prayer time this week!





### **ADORATION CHAPEL**

The only time Jesus asked His friends for anything was when He was in agony at the Garden of Gethsemani. Jesus said to them, "Could you not watch one hour with Me?" (Mt 26:40) Is Jesus important enough to you to set aside one special hour each week to be with Him? Just one hour once a week is all He is asking. This is simply a matter of putting first things first. "In everything you do, put God first, and He will direct you and crown your efforts with success." (Prov 3:6-10) Your faith will make this commitment easy. Your willingness to choose a specific hour is a precious expression of your faith in Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Think of the words of St. John Paul II, "Jesus waits for us in this Sacrament of Love" (Dominicae Cerae, Art 3). By spending a special hour adoring Jesus each week, you show Him that you love and welcome Him. When you get to heaven, Jesus will spend all eternity thanking you and loving you for your fidelity in spending one specific hour with Him in the Blessed Sacrament each week.


## PRO-LIFE THOUGHT OF THE WEEK FROM PROLIFECORNER.COM
