

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

A woman once related this story to me: I was telling my new workplace friend, Alice, about how awful my former boss had been, when she laughed and said, "So forget him. Why not just enjoy it here?" Then she went on to tell me a little story about herself:

I'm reminded of the time I moved a few years ago, she began. I was making enough money to have a professional mover pack for me, and when he asked what I wanted him to pack, I just waved my arm and said, "Everything!"

So when I got to my new place, I saw that he had taken me literally. Along with my furniture he had packed up all my trash bins; there I was in my beautiful new place with all my old garbage... including old newspapers, empty ketchup bottles, and grapefruit peels!

This is a little story, but I think it packs a big meaning. As we enter into a new year, we must not make the mistake of dragging the worst of the old year along with us. If we should learn anything from the Gospel it's that God is totally dedicated to offering us redemption new life and from mistakes. That's why Jesus suffered so horribly for us. He died so that our sins might be forgiven and that our relationship with God might be restored. Therefore, as you bravely welcome the year 2025 don't allow it to become like all the others. If there are changes that need to be made, then make them. If there are relationships to repair, repair them. Above all, do not enter into this New Year full of fear, because we are most especially a people of hope. As the great writer C.S. Lewis once said, "Hope is the essential Christian virtue." Therefore my hope and prayer for all of you is that 2025 will be a year full of blessing and grace for you and all your family.


PRO-LIFE THOUGHT OF THE WEEK FROM PROLIFECORNER.COM
