

### **MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR**

Years ago, this Feast was celebrated every year on January 1st (the octave of the Nativity) in keeping with Jewish Law & tradition. (See Leviticus 12:2–8). In more recent years it has been transferred to February 2<sup>nd</sup>, but we only celebrate it with a special liturgy when February 2nd falls on a Sunday. The theme of this liturgy is "Dedication" & throughout all of the readings we will see some aspect of dedication to the service and/or the will of God. Now, dedication in this context means more than just words or a pious expression. It means giving oneself to a special cause, family, spouse or to God in a special way that fits into His Plan of Salvation. Let us see how this definition is illustrated in the following readings.

The First Reading is from the Prophet Malachi (3:1-4). Malachi is the last book placed in the Old Testament & probably the shortest. Nevertheless, he has an important message for the people of Israel & indeed for people of all times & cultures. That message is a warning against the unacceptable forms of worship & dedication that the people are offering to God or the way they are living their daily lives. It is true that times were very difficult in the middle of the 5th Century BC; but rather than turning to God for help, the people are falling back into the ways that caused them to be exiled to Babylon. In this passage we hear a warning that a special messenger will come from God with great power & He will "purify the sons of Levi" with His message & His dedication & "then the sacrifice of Judah and Jerusalem will please the Lord." This was confirmed in the Baptism of the Lord Jesus when the Father says, "This is my Son in whom I am well pleased."

The Responsorial Psalm is (24:7-10). This short Psalm (10 verses) lays down the moral conditions for sincere (dedicated) worship of Christ the Lord when we are attending the Eucharist & also reflects the coming of the Lord of Glory to mankind for our salvation.

The Second Reading is from the Letter to the Hebrews (2:14-18). Within the Presentation ceremony in the temple, as described in the Gospel reading, was the circumcision of the male child. Circumcision was an act of dedication to God & involved the shedding of blood to remind mankind of its mortality. In Jesus' case, this minor shedding of blood was an indication of His dedication to the life & death that He was to live & give to God for our Salvation.

The Gospel Reading is from Luke (2:22-40). There are three stories entwined & all of them reflect a form of dedication to laws, to causes & hopes & finally to a Plan. Here, Mary & Joseph are fulfilling the Jewish Law which involves the purification of the new mother & the dedication of (or the Presentation of) the newborn child to God. This passage also talks about two elderly people who have spent most of their years in the temple waiting & praying for some sign of "the redemption of Israel." In this scene their eyes have been opened & their prayers have been answered; their dedication has been fulfilled.

When we come to church to celebrate the Holy Eucharist, do we do so with a mind & heart dedicated to God, or do we come to fulfill an obligation? Remember, mere presence within the church does not constitute Worship. Worship is the highest form of dedication; but it takes mind & heart, body & soul all working together with sincerity & humility.

Something to think about during your prayer time this week.





### St. Blaise, Bishop & Martyr, Armenia (d. 316) - Feast Day: February 3rd

St. Blaise was devoted to the Holy Eucharist. While imprisoned for his faith, he ministered to others and saved a child who was choking to death on a fish bone. News of the miracle spread and this led to the custom of the blessing of throats with two candles in church on his feast. St. Blaise was beheaded for his witness to Jesus.

### St. Agatha, Consecrated Virgin, Martyr, Patroness of Nurses, Breast Cancer, Italy (251) - Feast Day: February 5th

"For in ancient Christian piety, the Eucharist was the sacrifice banquet nourishing the life of grace.

This theology underlies the words by which St. Agatha describes her cure . . .

The Eucharist has power to heal; the healing of Agatha's wounds is repeated spiritually in our regard through the medicine of the Eucharist . . . usually the texts tells of the saint's transfiguration or glorification; a privilege we come to share through the Eucharist." ~Dr. Pius Parsch


Continue to pray to end abortion.

Cost is \$15 per person. Registration ends on February 9th.


