

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

In many passages of scripture, we hear that the message of God through Jesus Christ is endless, and so is the need for messengers to carry that message to "all nations." (Matt: 28:19) That is what the Readings for the Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time are all about: We are all called to participate in getting God's message out to the world. Ours might not be so dramatic a calling as was Isaiah's or Peter's or the others. Nevertheless, by this calling, or vocation, we are all given a role in God's Plan of Salvation.

The First Reading is from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah (6:1-8). This passage, which came early in Isaiah's life, recounts his being called into the service of God as a prophet. Although it is a very dramatic scene similar to the calling of the visionary, John, in the Book of Revelation, it is not the dramatics of the scene that are important but rather, the response of the one being called. Here, Isaiah answers that calling with his own, "Here I am, send me."

The Responsorial Psalm is (138:1-8). In this brief Psalm we hear the Psalmist give praise to God for the many blessings received. Obviously, this Psalmist was a true messenger for God because, like the prophets, the psalmist also speaks for God. Here he gives praise because "All the kings of the earth shall give thanks to you when they hear the words of your mouth."

The Second Reading is taken from St. Paul's Letter to the Corinthians (15:3-8, 11). (USCCB says 1 Corinthians 15:1-11 or 1 Corinthians 15:3-8, 11) St. Paul's conversion and calling to be God's messenger to the Gentiles was also very dramatic (See ACTS 9:1-9). Here, he recounts how he has carried out his responsibilities and the importance of his message for the salvation of all disciples of Jesus Christ. He then goes on to say that he does not do this on his own, but rather, because he was called by Christ to fulfill this special role. Like the apostles in the Gospel reading for today, Paul, once converted, dropped everything and gave his life to the preaching of Christ crucified.

The Gospel Reading is from the Gospel of St. Luke (5:1-11). In this passage we have another dramatic calling of the apostles into the service of God; and again, these three (Peter, James and John), the leaders when called, drop everything and follow Christ. Peter, realizing he was in the presence of divine holiness, utters that strange statement: "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." Obviously, Peter recognizing his own sinfulness reverts to the old Jewish concept of separation of the sinner from the Holy One. When we are called to serve God, He is always there ready and willing to help us fulfill whatever He asks of us. It is in the fulfilling of our call to service that makes us holy.

It is sad that so many people are lonely or bored without a purpose in life while at the same time, there are so many "needs" by others. Our Catholic faith is built on the idea of community and helping one another. Our call to serve God runs the full spectrum of human needs, both earthly and spiritual, and so we are challenged to answer the question: "Whom shall I send?" Hopefully we will respond as Isaiah did by saying: "Here I am; send me!"

Something to think about during your prayer time this week.




ADORATION CHAPEL

St. Paul Miki and Companions, Martyrs - Feast Day: February 6th

A native of Japan, St. Paul's family converted to Christianity when he was a child. Strengthened by the Eucharist, he proclaimed and defended the Catholic Faith. St. Paul & 25 other Catholics were crucified during a persecution. While hanging on the cross, St. Paul encouraged spectators to give their lives for Christ & forgave his enemies. He said: "Like my Master, I shall die upon the cross. Like Him, a lance will pierce my heart, so that my blood and my love can flow out upon the land and sanctify it to His name."

St. Josephine Bakhita, Religious, Africa (1869-1947) - Feast Day: February 8th

Following her kidnapping from Darfur, Sudan, St. Josephine was tortured and enslaved. Later, she was bought by a good family, eventually freed, and went to Italy with them at the age of 21. She was attracted to Catholicism because of the true presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. She converted and became a Canossian Sister. St. Josephine spent many hours daily in Eucharistic Adoration. She said: "I will send from heaven lots of graces for the salvation of souls."





He was ordained a Priest in 2008 in the Catholic Diocese of Cleveland. He is also currently the Chaplin of the First Catholic Slovak Union in the Diocese of Cleveland.
